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Registration opens February 1, 2017!

Summer Program Overview

7:30 am–8:30 am Extended Care

Extended Care, which opens at 7:30 a.m., is available at no additional fee. Students should be checked into the program in our Extended Care room in the Farana Center; an adult must sign-in students to the program each morning.

8:30 am–12:00 pm Summer Workshops (June 27–July 28)

Our workshops program allows students to enroll in weeklong enrichment courses to supplement a student's school year curriculum. The workshops will cover a variety of academic and extra-curricular topics and a qualified instructor teaches each course. Each workshop is 90 minutes long; students will participate in two workshops per day, with a 30-minute recess between the workshops. Please see the next pages for a full listing of workshops; some workshops will require a supply fee. Workshop topics will vary from week to week, for example, if you enroll your child in math each week, the curriculum focus will be different.

12:00 pm–4:30 pm Summer Camp

Students will eat lunch, and then participate in the afternoon program, including both on-campus activities and off-site field trips. A full calendar of activities will be provided before the start of Summer Camp. On-campus activities will include water play and guest speakers/performers. Hot lunch will be available for purchase every day. For the weeks of June 12–23 and July 31–August 4, our Summer Camp program is full-day, as there are no workshops offered during those weeks. This year's off-campus field trips are scheduled to include Aqua Adventure, Gilroy Gardens, San Jose Giants Baseball, swimming, bowling, Great America, and more!

4:30–6:00 pm Extended Care

Extended Care is available at no additional fee, and closes at 6:00 pm. An adult who is authorized on the emergency form must sign-out students from the program. There will be a \$5.00 late fee, due in cash at the time of pick-up, for every 5 minutes after 6:00 pm that your child is not picked up.

Note: Workshops do have minimum and maximum enrollment requirements; Camp does have a maximum enrollment. Priority will be based on date that paid registration is received. Advance registration and payment of a deposit is required; we may not be able to accommodate last-minute registrations due to maximum weekly capacity being reached. Most workshops will be offered in two sessions, broken out by grade level. Some workshops will require an additional supply fee, as indicated by (\$).

Registration Process

Registration opens on February 1, 2017. To register for the summer program, please go to goo.gl/XLlXq6 (case sensitive) and complete the online registration code. Once you have registered online, please mail or drop off your deposit in the school office for \$75 per week/per child. Your spot will not be fully reserved until the deposit is received. You will receive an email to confirm your registration.

We do offer three registration options:

- ◆ **Morning workshops only** **\$235 per week per child**
 - Includes morning Extended Care
 - Available June 26-July 30
- ◆ **Full day (morning workshops + afternoon camp)** **\$350 per week per child**
 - Includes morning and evening Extended Care
 - Available June 26-July 30
- ◆ **Camp Only (full day camp program)** **\$350 per week per child**
 - Includes morning and evening Extended Care
 - Available June 12-23 and July 31-August 4

Lunch Information

This year, we will be offering an option to purchase lunch every day. More specifics about lunch will be provided prior to the start of the Summer Program.

Camp T-Shirts

All students will receive a camp t-shirt on their first day; this is included in their registration costs. Additional t-shirts will be available for \$10.00 each. Students must wear the camp t-shirt on all field trips. The shirts are the same as last year, so if you still have one, feel free to re-use it!

Program for 7th and 8th grade students

We are excited to have a workshop program for 7th and 8th grade students. Each week, our 7th and 8th graders will participate in the two morning workshops that are being offered. Then in the afternoon, they will be teen helpers for our camp program, where students can earn community service hours for helping during the activities. Additionally, students can apply to be teen helpers during the morning workshops; a few students may be needed each week to help with this. Because the 7th and 8th grade program is only in the morning, the cost will be a reduced fee of \$235; during camp-only weeks, the fee is \$75. Lunch is included in the registration fee for 7th and 8th grade students only. For full registration for 7th and 8th grade students, parents should fill out the online Program Registration and students should fill out the Teen Helper Application (see below).

Teen Helpers

Our teen helpers are a valuable part of our Summer Program; they learn valuable leadership skills while earning community service hours and working with the Camp Staff! 7th and 8th grade students can apply to be teen helpers in the afternoons during Summer Camp. High school students can apply to be teen helpers for our full day Summer Program. The application will be available on February 1, 2017, and can be found at goo.gl/cQUxZ4 (case sensitive). Application deadline is Friday, June 2, 2017. Interviews will be scheduled as applications are received; teen helper positions are limited and will be filled in the order applications are received and students are interviewed.

Financial Policies

- ◆ Please make checks payable to Resurrection School.
- ◆ A \$25 fee will be charged for any returned check or rejected debit/credit card charge.
- ◆ Credit cards will be accepted for tuition payments or lunch purchases; \$10 minimum purchase applies. A service fee will be applied for any credit/debit card payments.
Fees are as follows:
 - \$0-100: \$1.00
 - \$101-300: \$3.00
 - \$301 and up: \$5.00
- ◆ For current Resurrection School families, FACTS will be a tuition payment option; more information will be available shortly.
- ◆ The paid deposit is applied to the weekly summer camp fee; the balance is due at 8:30 am on the Monday of each week your child attends the summer program.
- ◆ Priority will be based on date that paid registration is received.
- ◆ The registration fee is non-refundable.
- ◆ A tuition discount of 10% for Resurrection School families and 5% for non-Resurrection School families will be given to any family who pre-registers by June 2, 2017, and attends at least 6 out of the 8 weeks of the Summer Program.
- ◆ Advance registration and payment of a deposit is required; we may not be able to accommodate last-minute registrations due to maximum weekly capacity being reached.
- ◆ There is no pro-rating tuition for days that your child does not attend Summer Camp or for the 4th of July holiday.
- ◆ There is no daily registration option; all registration is on a weekly basis. Students must be pre-registered for the week(s) they will attend; there is no drop-in option.
- ◆ There is a sibling discount for two or more children in a family; tuition is reduced by \$20 per child, starting with the second child.
- ◆ Financial assistance is available to Resurrection School families on an as-needed basis. For more information, please contact the Summer Program Director at sanderson@resparish.org.
- ◆ Workshops do have minimum and maximum enrollment requirements; Camp does have a maximum enrollment.
- ◆ Most workshops will be offered in two sessions, broken out by grade level.
- ◆ Some workshops will require an additional supply fee, as indicated in the schedule.

Frequently Asked Questions

- ◆ **How do I register my child?** Go to goo.gl/XLIXq6 (case sensitive) and complete the online registration, then drop off or mail the deposit in the school office. Registration will be available starting February 1, 2017.
- ◆ **Is lunch available to purchase?** Lunch will be available for purchase every day. Sign-ups will occur daily and weekly.
- ◆ **Is there a sibling discount?** There is a sibling discount of \$20 off per child, starting with the second child from the same family.
- ◆ **Is there financial aid available for the Summer Program?** Yes, a limited amount of financial assistance is available to currently enrolled Resurrection School families on an as-needed basis. Please contact the Summer Program Director at sanderson@resparish.org for more information.
- ◆ **Is there a daily rate available?** No, we are not offering a daily rate. We have to make arrangements ahead of time for field trip transportation, reservations, and admission, and have to know our weekly enrollment numbers. We also cannot accommodate drop-ins; students must be registered ahead of time.
- ◆ **Will there be homework in the Summer Workshops?** No homework! The summer workshops are designed to help students keep their academic skills sharp in a fun, enriching way, and to help them be better prepared for the new school year.
- ◆ **Can a student attend afternoons only?** No, we do not have an afternoons only program. Our program is designed for mornings only, to attend the summer workshops, or for full day students, who attend the summer workshops in the morning and the Summer Camp program in the afternoon.
- ◆ **Are the summer workshops organized by age/grade?** Yes, the workshops will be split up by grade level and based on enrollment. The curriculum covered in the workshops will be specialized to the age group of the students in that session.
- ◆ **Why are some of the workshops offered for Kindergarten-6th grade students together?** Based on our experience, some of the workshops are best offered for all students together, either for enrollment purposes or because of the topic. It's no fun to play volleyball if there are only 5 people in the class! Teachers will still group students based on age when appropriate, but by combining age groups, we have the ability to offer the best possible program for our students.
- ◆ **Are the summer programs available to students who do not attend Resurrection?** Yes, just fill out the standard application.

- ◆ **What are the age ranges of students who can attend the summer programs?** Our Summer Program is open to students entering Kindergarten through 8th grade in the Fall of 2017.
- ◆ **How does my 7th or 8th grade student sign up to be a teen helper?** 7th and 8th grade students should fill out the teen helper application at goo.gl/cQUxZ4 (case sensitive). Deadline to submit a teen helper application is June 2. Openings will be filled on a first-come basis.
- ◆ **If I enroll my child in (math, reading/writing, cooking, etc.) each week, will they get bored?** We hope not! The curriculum focus will be different each week, so if they take science each week, they will learn something new each week!
- ◆ **Are there additional fees for field trips?** No, the cost for the field trip transportation, admission, activities, etc. is included in the price of the Summer Program. For some of the field trips, there will be an option to purchase lunch.
- ◆ **What is the method of transportation for field trips?** We will take school buses on most of the field trips. A few of the field trips are close enough that we are able to walk. When we take a school bus, it is rented through the local public school district, follows all rules of safety as prescribed by state and local laws, and is driven by a licensed bus driver.
- ◆ **My child is in high school. Are there volunteer opportunities for them?** Yes, we love our teen helpers! Please have the high school student fill out the teen helper application at goo.gl/cQUxZ4 (case sensitive). Any questions can be directed to Ms. Anderson, Summer Program Director, at sanderson@resparish.org. The deadline to submit a teen helper application is June 2. There is a limited number of spaces available, and interviews will be scheduled on a first-come basis.
