2. Write a well-thought out paragraph answering each of the following prompts:
 - Describe one special talent, interest, or achievement about which you are most proud. What have you learned about yourself as a result of this experience?
 - Explain what you contribute to Resurrection School. Discuss an interest, idea, belief, or extra-curricular activity (athletics, clubs, performing arts, student leadership, community service, etc.) that helps you be a leader and make an impact at our school.
