Resurrection School is committed to providing financial aid to our families desiring a Catholic education for their children. Financial Aid is available for families through the Diocese of San José, the BASIC Fund Group, and the school itself. Financial Aid is awarded on the basis of demonstrated financial need. Financial aid decisions at the Diocesan and school level are guided by the family's financial data submitted on-line to FACTS Grant & Aid and reviewed by the school's financial aid administrative committee.

The BASIC Fund Assistance - (Applications open in mid January 2022 - Deadline is March 31st, 2022)

The BASIC Fund is a privately funded organization providing partial-tuition scholarships to low-income families across the Bay Area. This program is intended as a helping hand for families enrolling their children at a private school for the first time, and is available to children entering Transitional Kindergarten - 8th grade. **On-line applications for the 2022-2023 school year are available on the BASIC Fund's website beginning in mid-January of 2022. March 31st, 2022 is the deadline for the 2022-2023 school year. Applications received after the deadline are placed on a waitlist and if funds are available, the organization will turn to its waitlisted families.** It is strongly encouraged for families to apply for this program if you fall under the fund's parameters. If accepted, families will qualify for aid from the BASIC Fund for the remainder of their time at Resurrection School. Note that your 2021 tax return will be required for the application.

Diocese of San José Assistance, Guardian Angel Program, and Resurrection School Assistance

The following four forms of financial assistance are available via a one-time on-line application through FACTS Grant & Aid. There is a \$32 charge payable to FACTS to apply for financial assistance. Through February of 2022, your 2020 tax returns and any supporting tax schedules along with your 2021 W-2/1099 are required to apply.

Diocese of San José Assistance and the Guardian Angel Program (Deadline is February 15th, 2022)

The Diocese of San José is committed to supporting families throughout the diocese with financial assistance from its Endowment fund. To apply for Diocesan assistance, the Guardian Angel Program*, and Resurrection School aid, families must submit their financials to FACTS Grant & Aid. FACTS provides the Diocese's financial aid administrative team and the Resurrection School's principal with a report to assist in the evaluation and distribution of school aid. Available to children entering Transitional Kindergarten through 8th grade. **February 15th, 2022 is the deadline for the 2022-2023 school year for the initial allocation of financial aid.**

Resurrection School Assistance (Deadline is February 15th, 2022 for the initial round of assistance, then on-going throughout the school year while funds are available)

Resurrection School annually budgets financial aid to assist families in our school community wishing to obtain a Catholic education for their children. To apply for school aid, families must submit their financials to FACTS Grant & Aid. Catholic families actively involved in Resurrection Church and parish are also eligible for the "In-parish" tuition rate. Available to children entering Kindergarten through 8th grade with exceptions for siblings enrolling in Transitional Kindergarten. **February 15th, 2022 is the deadline for the 2022-2023 school year for the initial allocation of financial aid.** Families may apply throughout the year for assistance while funds are available.

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Guardian Angel Program Scholarships from the Diocese of San Jose´

Guardian Angel Program Scholarships are privately funded partial-tuition scholarships to families enrolling in a Catholic elementary school within the Diocese of San Jose helping them afford the cost of tuition. This program is intended as a helping hand for families enrolling their children at a Diocese of San José elementary school for the first time.

Our model of providing partial tuition scholarships to families is one of the simplest, most immediate and effective ways to educate children and empower families in their choice for a Catholic education.

Our mission is to serve and form all children who desire a Catholic education and to broaden the educational opportunities for families in and around Santa Clara County by helping them afford the cost of tuition at one of the Catholic elementary schools within the Diocese of San José.

Frequently asked questions

What are the income guidelines to qualify for a GAP Scholarship?

Income limits are based on the 2021 Area Median Income for Santa Clara County as reported by the US Department of Housing and Urban Development. New GAP Scholarships are awarded annually as long as funding is available.

Who Qualifies for the Scholarships?

Scholarships are awarded to children who are entering a Catholic elementary school within the Diocese of San José for the first time in grades Transitional Kindergarten through fifth (TK - 5th) grade, and whose families fall within the financial guidelines of the program. New GAP Scholarships are awarded as long as funding remains available.

Can students apply to any Catholic elementary school?

Yes, as long as the Catholic elementary school is within the Diocese of San José, the school serves TK - 8th grades, and the child meets all admissions requirements of the school to which s/he applies.

How much do the scholarships cover?

Scholarships cover \$2,500 annually per child enrolled in a Catholic elementary school in the Diocese of San José.

What are the family's responsibilities?

Participating families shall work with the school principal, or his/her delegate, to determine the actual tuition rate for the 2022-2023 school year. Participating families are required to contribute a minimum of \$1,500 per child towards their child's education and are responsible for all costs not covered by the scholarship. Additionally, parents must agree to participate in their child's education through involvement with the school as set out by the school and by providing an encouraging and supportive environment.

How do I apply, what are the document requirements, and what is the deadline?

Applications must be submitted through FACTS Grant & Aid, which includes uploading all relevant financial documents, such as 2021 1040 and 2021 W-2 and/or 1099. Deadline to submit the application for consideration of a GAP Scholarship is **February 15th, 2022**.

Are GAP Scholarships renewable and what are the requirements for renewal?

GAP Scholarships are renewable for as long as the child is continually enrolled in a Catholic school within the Diocese of San Jose´. Families must remain financially eligible according to the GAP's financial guidelines and up to date with their payments to the school in order to renew their scholarship. Families must complete the tuition assistance application through FACTS Grant & Aid each year to be considered for renewal of their GAP Scholarship.

Can a GAP Scholarship be combined with one granted by The BASIC Fund?

Because of our deep belief in serving all children and in an effort to support as many children choosing a Catholic education as possible, GAP Scholarships may not be combined with scholarships awarded by The BASIC Fund. Contact the school for more information.
