Quantity	Item
1	1" binder (White only please)
1	Pack of stickers of things that begin with the first letter of your child's name (i.e. David=dog, Makenzie=monkey, Jacob=jack in the box)
1	Box of facial tissues
2	Rolls of paper towels
2	Packages of baby wipes
2	Containers of disinfecting wipes (Clorox, Lysol, etc.)
1	Ream (500 sheets) of white copy/printer paper (8.5 x 11)

Personal Use (Please write your child's name on these items.)

2	Jumbo glue sticks
1	Pack Crayola markers (8 or 10 count, broad line)
2	Dry erase markers (any color)
1	Set of Crayola watercolors (8 count)
1	Headphones (please make sure they fit your child's ears)
