General Classroom Supplies (These items do not need to be labeled.)

Quantity	Item
1	Package of Crayola markers (broad line)
2	Packs of crayons (8 count)
1	Crayola watercolor set (8 count)
1	Box of colored pencils (12 count)
1	Pack of child-friendly stickers (i.e. animals, teddy bears, flowers, etc.)
1	Package of inexpensive white paper plates for art projects
2	Rolls of paper towels
2	Packages of baby wipes
1	Ream (500 sheets) of white copy/printer paper (8.5 x 11)

Personal Use (Please write your child's name on the inside of these items.)

Quantity	Item
1	Regular backpack – large enough to hold a folder, jacket, and lunchbox. No rolling backpacks.
2	Folders with pockets at the bottom
1	Lunchbox
1	Water bottle (to use at snack and lunchtime, "sports cap" or straw variety preferred)
1	Change of clothes, underclothes, and socks in large Ziploc bag (in case of soiled clothes)
1	<i>Small</i> blanket and <i>small</i> stuffed animal for rest time, no pillows
1	Headphones to use with iPad (please make sure they fit your child's ears)



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THINGS TO WORK ON WITH YOUR TK STUDENT

Tips to work on	Examples and Suggestions:
♥ Learn to recognize full name and nickname(s)	- With capitals and lowercase
♥ Hold a pencil correctly	- Teach your child to grasp the pencil towards the pointed end
♥ Practice scissor skills	- Practice holding the scissors appropriately - Practice cutting (opening and closing) - Play with Play-doh to help build the muscles in the hands
♥ Practice coloring	- Use a side-to-side or up-and-down technique
♥ Practice manners	- Model saying "Please" and "Thank You" - Practice saying "Excuse me" when adults are talking
♥ Read books to your child everyday	- Visit your local library - Read books in the language you use at home - Read about things that interest your child
♥ Talk about social skills	- Practice sharing and taking turns - Using words to help communicate a problem or need
♥ Help your child take responsibility	- Let your child clean up their messes - Practice dressing themselves, including doing zippers, buttons, and tying their shoes (if they'll be wearing shoes with laces on them) - Go to the bathroom on their own (self-help skills: wiping their own bottom), flushing the toilet and washing their hands after using the bathroom - Blowing their nose
♥ Number and shape recognition	- Count objects and find shapes daily - Recognize numbers and number names - Recognize shapes and shape names
♥ Letter/sound recognition	- Practice saying letters, and their sounds daily - Recognize letters and letter names
